The Heritage of Matt and Mary Detling

Heritage for Matt Detling

Matt's parents, Sebastian and Elizabeth (Volk) Dettling (with two 't's) were both born in Odessa, Russia. Matt's father Sebastian was born in 1874 to Joseph Dettling and mother unknown – Sebastian and his brother Karl, born in 1876, became orphans. Matt's mother Elizabeth was born in 1876 to Joseph Volk and Lenora (Weninger) Volk.

Sebastian and Elizabeth married in 1899 at Manheim, Odessa, Russia. Their first child, 1Magdalena, who later became Sister Crescentia, was born in 1900. In 1902, Sebastian and Elizabeth, together with their young daughter, departed by ship from Liverpool, England and immigrated to Canada. 2Mathias 'Matt' J. Detling, was born February 13, 1903 near South Qu'Appelle, Saskatchewan, Canada. Less than a year later, Matt's father, Sebastian, died instantly of an accidental discharge of a gun, as noted in the November 6, 1903 issue of *Star-Phoenix* newspaper of Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, Canada.

After the passing of Matt's father, Sebastian, his mother, Elizabeth, married a second time in 1904 to Nicholas Thomas (b. 1867 in Russia) and they moved to North Dakota. Nicholas' first wife Frances Schell had died leaving three surviving children. Nicholas died on April 19, 1905 while working on Elizabeth's and his farm just prior to the birth of their son 3Nicholas J. Thomas on May 25, 1905.

After the passing of Elizabeth's second husband, Nicholas, she married a third time later in 1905 in Towner, North Dakota to John Heilman (b. 1872 in Russia). John's first wife had died leaving four children. Together, Elizabeth and John had six children of their own: 4Joseph 1906, 5Jacob 1908, 6Wendell 1910, 7Rose 1912, 8Barbara 1913, and 9Benedict 1915.

At the time of Elizabeth's death, January 2, 1956, she and John had been married 50 years. John died December 2, 1957. They are both buried in the Mount Carmel Cemetery, Balta, North Dakota. In Elizabeth's obituary in the Pierce County Tribune, January 12, 1956, it states: "Mr. and Mrs. Heilman farmed for 31 years in Reno Valley Township, Pierce County. In 1939, they retired and moved to Balta where they lived until last July. Since that time they made their home with their daughter Rose and family, Mr. and Mrs. Nick Heisler, Esmond."

Matt's sister, Magdalena, entered as a Postulant in 1924 and was in the Novitiate at Stella Nigara, New York during 1925-1926, giving her Profession of Final Vows in 1930. She was assigned to various states such as Nebraska, Montana and California serving at several convents during 1926 to about 1950. She died in 1957 and is buried at Calvary Cemetery, Los Angeles, California.

The Heritage of Matt and Mary Detling

Heritage for Mary (Fix) Detling

The parents of Mary Anna Fix were Franz 'Frank' Fix and Elizabeth (Buchmeier) Fix. Mary's father, Frank Fix, was born in 1876, one of six children to Joseph Fix and Agnes (Bachmeier) Fix in Franzfeld, Odessa, Russia. In 1881, when Frank was five years old, the family made a month-long trip by boat to the USA.

After Frank, his siblings, and his parents Joseph and Agnes Fix arrived in Eureka, South Dakota, Joseph and other men found employment working on the railroad out of Eureka for a time to earn money. Later, Joseph and Agnes homesteaded in Hillside Township, Pierce County, near Selz, North Dakota. When Joseph and Agnes retired, they moved into Selz. Joseph died in 1935 and Agnes died in 1941. They are both buried in St. Anthony Cemetery, Selz, Pierce County, North Dakota, USA.

Mary's mother, Elizabeth, was born in 1878, one of five children to Ignatz 'Ned' Buchmeier and Philomena (Thomas) Buchmeier in Ukrainets, Kurgan, Russia. Her siblings were Marianna who married Alexander Degenstein, Philomena who married Egide Gross, Josephine who married Stanuis Martin, and Carl who married Pauline Schmitz. The family immigrated to the USA in the late 1880s. Ned and Philomena homesteaded near Orrin, North Dakota. Ignatz died in 1923 and Philomena died in 1935, and are both buried in the Orrin Cemetery, Pierce County, North Dakota, USA.

Frank and Elizabeth were married on July 4, 1904. They homesteaded on Section 30 of Alexander Township in Pierce County near Selz where they farmed until retiring to Harvey in 1936. Elizabeth died in 1951 and Frank died in 1971.



Matt and Mary's Heritage Roots

Matt and Mary Detling stem from the heritage of Germans who were among people of various countries invited to move to the part of Russia that is now Ukraine, to settle and farm the land there. The book, <u>From the Steppes to the Prairies</u> by Msgr. George P. Aberle, published in 1963, is the story of Germans settling in Russia on the Volga and Ukraine, Germans settling in the Banat, Bohemians settling in Crimea, and their resettlement in North and South America and in Canada. The Germans living in Russia had built a fairly good life until the Russians began to break their promises, after which the Germans endured many hardships in leaving and in making their way to a new land.

Mathias 'Matt' J. Detling was born February 13, 1903, near South Qu'Appelle, Saskatchewan, Canada. He was the second of two children born to Sebastian and Elizabeth (Volk) Dettling who were both born in Odessa, Russia now Ukraine. The family immigrated to Canada in about 1902. Sebastian died when Matt was less than a year old.

Matt's mother, Elizabeth, married a second time in 1904 to Nicholas Thomas at which time the family moved to North Dakota. Elizabeth was soon widowed a second time, but remarried in 1905 in Towner, North Dakota to John Heilman. The family first lived at Orrin, North Dakota and in 1910, when Matt was about seven years old, the family moved to a farm near Rugby, North Dakota where Matt grew to adulthood. Matt spelled his surname with one 't,' as Detling.

Mary Anna Fix was born February 27, 1907 near Selz, North Dakota one of five children to Frank and Elizabeth (Buchmeier) Fix, who were both born in Odessa, Russia now Ukraine. They had immigrated to the USA in the late 1800s. Mary grew up on the family farm near Selz.

Matt and Mary were married February 4, 1928 in Selz and began farming near Silva, North Dakota. Matt and Mary welcomed their first child 1Ann in 1928, then 2Lena in 1930, 3Sebastian in 1931 who died at five days old, 4Burga in 1932, 5Betty in 1934, 6Emanuel in 1936, 7Grace in 1938, 8Joe in 1939, and 9Leo in 1941. Matt's mother Elizabeth assisted Mary in childbirth of these children. The other children were born in a hospital. 10Matt, Jr. was born in 1942 in the Rugby hospital.

In 1944, Matt and Mary and family moved to a farm about four miles southwest of Manfred. Their remaining children were born in the Harvey hospital. In 1945, they welcomed twin boys, 11Harry and 12Garry, into the family, then 13Ned in 1946, 14Bill in 1948, 15Clara in 1950, and 16Lorretta in 1952. Matt and Mary were members of St. Augustine's Catholic Church in Fessenden and the Manfred Farmers Union Elevator.

In addition to his farm work, Matt also did custom baling. Mary was a part of Christian Mothers as noted in the September 16, 1950 issue of the Wells County Free Press, "The Christian Mothers were entertained at the Matt Detling home Sunday evening. Prizes were won by Mrs. M. F. Jenny and Audrey Strauss. Mrs. Detling served a very delicious lunch at the close of the meeting."

Primary school for the older children began at Silva and continued at the school in Manfred where the younger children also attended. Most of the children had Myrtle Rogness as their teacher for the first four grades with different teachers for grades five through eight. At home, the children learned the importance of a hard work ethic. They helped, not only on their parent's farm, but also at neighboring farms. They did work such as shocking grain, chores, as well as babysitting for many people in the Manfred area.

Family memories of Matt and Mary include: that they enjoyed watching Lawrence Welk's musical television program; that they made such things as homemade ice cream, sausage, smoked fish, and German Russian ethnic foods; that Mary planted a large garden and did a lot of canning; and that they had a strong faith and moral values. After Matt retired from farming and sold the farm in 1966, the family moved to Harvey where they attended St. Cecilia Catholic Church. Matt and Mary enjoyed visits from family, including their many grandchildren. Matt died September 1, 1976 while hospitalized in Bismarck, and Mary died August 12, 1980 in the Harvey hospital. Both died at age 73 and are buried in St. Cecilia Cemetery at Harvey.

1 ANN

Anna Mary Detling was born October 13, 1928, near Silva, North Dakota, and attended school in Silva. Ann lived and worked in Fargo before marrying Edward 'Ed' Sauter, from Anamoose, North Dakota, June 28, 1948, in Fessenden.

Ed and Ann, together with their children, moved to Roseburg, Oregon, in 1964. Ann worked as a waitress many years, which included 30 years at local establishments in Roseburg. The *Roseburg News Review* featured an article on Ann in 1986 in which she was described as "quick-witted, always smiling and humming, and always having something to say as she waited tables."

Ann and Ed, many times accompanied by their daughter Debora 'Debbiee,' enjoyed making trips to family get-togethers, camping and fishing at the Oregon Coast, and visits from their children and grandchildren in Roseburg. Ed died February 24, 1994, at the age of 69. In her later years, Ann enjoyed spending time with her family and crocheting gifts for everyone. Ann died September 11, 2013, at the age of 84. Ann and Ed are both buried in Roseburg Memorial Gardens, Roseburg, Oregon.

Ann and Ed had three children: 1David married Teresa Maroney Counts and they have two children: 1Travis Counts-Sauter and 2Jeremy David 'JD' has a daughter Ulionna; 2Debbiee married Gerald Griffin. Debbiee died December 29, 2013 at age 59 from lung cancer; and 3Dorinda married Tony Miller and they have two children: 1Kristen married Brett Smith and they have two children: Kendal and Lainey, and 2Joshua married Justine Gardiner.

Magdalena 'Lena' Detling was born January 1, 1930, near Silva, North Dakota. She attended school in the Silva and Manfred public schools. Lena lived and worked in Fargo prior to her marriage to Aloys 'Al' Walz on June 22, 1953 in Fessenden.

In 1957, Al and Lena moved to a farm near Mahnomen, Minnesota. They, together with their daughter Karen, took many trips to attend family gatherings. Lena enjoyed sewing and crocheting. Al retired from farming in 1991, and they later moved to Fargo. Al died May 20, 2006 at the age of 76.

In 2011, Lena became a resident of Manor Care Health Services in Fargo, now known as Meadows on University. She likes putting puzzles together, bingo, crafts, and especially enjoys the music entertainment.

Al and Lena had three children: **1**Karen died from cancer November 15, 2011 at the age of 57; **2**Eugene 'Gene' married Nancy Bell. Gene had two children: **1**Adam married Jessica Schumacher and **2**Nicole married Jarett Lettner. Nancy had two children: Susan and Erik; and **3**Steven married Corinna Klett who had two children: Angela has two children: Leya and Tugg, and Jeremiah.

Sebastian Detling was born September 5, 1931 and died September 10, 1931. He is buried in a cemetery near Silva, North Dakota.

4 BURGA

Notaburga 'Burga' Detling was born December 8, 1932, near Silva, North Dakota. She attended school at Silva and Manfred. She married Orville Smestad on October 7, 1957 in Fessenden. Orville and Burga made their home in Valley City.

Being actively involved in her three sons' Boy Scouts activities was important to Burga, in which she served as a den mother. She also obtained a G.E.D. Burga worked as a waitress many years in Valley City.


